First Dog To Earn Agility Grand Championship Title

Brandy is the first (and only) French Bulldog to earn an Agility Grand Championship title, along with being the first in the breed to earn 8 other agility titles, which include:

- Premier Standard (Regular & Preferred)
- Premier Jumpers (Regular & Preferred)
- Time2Beat3 (Preferred)
- Time2Beat4 (Preferred)
- Master FAST Preferred Silver
- Master FAST Preferred Gold

Brandy is also the recipient of the FBDCA Outstanding Agility Dog Regular Division in 2022 and 2023. She was also the recipient of the FBDCA Outstanding Agility Dog Preferred Division in 2022. Brandy has also been the recipient of a FBDCA lifetime award, The Babar Award for Outstanding Achievement In Agility in 2023.

First Dog To Earn Retriever Title in AKC Fetch Program

Ewald is THE FIRST DOG to earn Retriever Title in AKC Fetch Program. His name sounds familiar, because Ewald is already a celebrity among French bulldogs. You might recognize Ewald from his prior achievement excelling in Barn Hunt. He is the dog that the FBDC A Ewald Award for Outstanding Lifetime Achievement in Barn Hunt was created in honor of. Ewald has recently achieved another milestone in his illustrious career. He has now become the first dog (and of course, the first French Bulldog) to attain the Fetch Retriever title in the newly developed AKC Fetch Program.

Mary Burch PHD, The AKC Family Dog Director, states: I am pleased to write this letter of support for “Ewald”. I first met Ewald when the Macon Kennel Club agreed to pilot test AKC’s new Fetch title tests. There are four levels of Fetch, with the most advanced being the Retriever level that requires dogs to perform Double and Triple retrieves. Imagine my surprise when the very first dog in the country to pass the Retriever level of Fetch was Ewald, a French Bulldog. Ewald contributed so significantly throughout the development of the AKC Fetch program that his image was used as the program’s logo. A French Bulldog on a Fetch logo says, “This program isn’t just for sporting breeds—all dogs can do it.” Ewald is a great representative of his breed; he is adaptable, affectionate, active, and playful, just like the breed standard says.
